Aggression towards Ambulance Personnel

Mr Stephenson said there was a "significant act of violence" against a paramedic every day and the number of assaults are under-reported.

"A lot of paramedics will tolerate this stuff and ignore it. I don't think you'd tolerate something to this extreme but they do tolerate aggression reasonably frequently," he said.

"It is an increasing phenomenon. It's something we're increasingly concerned about.


"Our number one priority really is to provide a safe workplace for our guys and at the moment that's a pretty difficult thing to do when these sorts of things are happening."

Mr Stephenson said Ambulance Victoria has a close relationship with police who regularly helped paramedics on duty.

However, he said, with more than 1,000 cases a day and half of them at night it would not be practical to have officers

escort paramedics to every job.

We, as retired Ambulance personnel, deplore these type of actions and offer our support to any and all our colleagues who have suffered from the now constant threats to their safety something we never considered would happen. Certainly not in our time as Ambulance Officers. This is something we certainly did not have to endure..

The new 24 hour Maffra Ambulance Branch was officially opened on Wednesday April 20

It coincided with a community open day which included tours of the branch, a meet and greet with paramedics and CPR demonstrations.

The branch was funded by the former Coalition Government and Ambulance Victoria.

The branch houses sixteen paramedics and includes a mix of advanced life support paramedics and intensive care paramedics.

Member for Gippsland East Tim Bull says the facility is a great use of taxpayers' funds to support such an important emergency service.

"The new station has been the final

component of improving services and I am pleased that during our term in office we were able to provide more paramedics to Maffra."

MAFFRA'S ambulance service has become a 24-hour multi-officer station after receiving six new paramedics since the second half of last year.

Maffra ambulance service acting team manager Sandra Tozer said the changes should improve services in the region, reducing response times in the immediate area

She said the addition of six new staff

would mean "24 hours a day you will get a two-person response paramedic".

Three ambulances operate out of the Maffra depot, their normal 24-hour response vehicle, a special Complex Patient Ambulance Vehicle, referred to as a CPAV, and a 'city sprinter' ambulance with four-wheel drive capability.

The CPAV is the depot's pride and

joy, according to Ms Tozer.

While it is stationed at Maffra permanently, it has been used to respond to patients in Bairnsdale, Lakes Entrance and Traralgon.
