## Peer Dogs Take the Lead



Ambulance Victoria's newest recruits have been unveiled – 10 additional Peer Support Dogs to help with the mental health and wellbeing of employees.

They include three Golden Retrievers (Daisy, Chomp and Ted), two Labradors (Gracie and Angus), an Australian Shepherd (Skye), a Standard Poodle (Anna), an English Staffordshire Bull Terrier (Cash), an Old English Sheepdoq (Millie) and a Groodle (Boomer).

Ambulance Victoria's first Peer Support Dog, Labrador Bruce (now seven years old), and his handler paramedic and peer support coordinator Ken Whittle, have visited hundreds of locations as part of the pilot program and helped nearly 3,000 paramedics.

The program started in May 2018 and is now being rolled out across the state with 12 dogs and handlers.

Ambulance Victoria Chief Executive Officer Tony Walker said the expansion was a significant milestone.

"Spending time with a peer support dog can help break down barriers and start conversations with our peer support staff that may not otherwise happen," Associate Professor Walker said.

Research shows emergency service workers report higher levels of depression, anxiety,

post-traumatic stress disorder and fatigue.

Bruce's handler Ken said since the introduction of the program, he had been "overwhelmed" by the "changes in people's faces" when they spent time with Bruce.

Each accredited peer support dog will work up to four shifts per month as requests for support are received.

Their handlers will return to their regular jobs when their dogs are not engaged in sanctioned "work" activities.

Peer dogs and responders are extensively trained for their roles and undergo regular supervision, assessment and refresher courses.

Any AV staff member who owns a dog and meets the criteria can apply to be part of the program

### Take Care in the Smoke

Paramedics are urging people to take care with much of the state blanketed in smoke from bushfires.

Acting Director of Emergency Management Justin Dunlop said paramedics have seen a big increase in Triple Zero (000) calls to people with breathing problems.

'Last week we saw a 51 per cent increase in the number of people reporting breathing problems, and we think that's largely due to smoke,' Mr Dunlop said.

Breathing problems calls increased from an average of 187 per day to 282 yesterday, with a spike in the evening.

'Most of that increase was in Melbourne where there's a bigger population. Many of those we were called to were taken to hospital.

Children and people with preexisting health conditions are at greatest risk.

The children, the elderly, people with asthma, emphysema and heart disease are at a greater risk of being affected by smoke,' Mr Dunlop said.

'If you have asthma or a lung condition and you develop symptoms such as shortness of breath, coughing or

Hi everyone,

As I write this contribution, Victoria has been declared a State of Disaster for six Local Government Areas and Alpine Resorts with, multiple fires ongoing across the state. Needless to say, it has been a busy and confronting time for all emergency services and the impact for our communities is far reaching. Smoke haze continues to impact a number of communities statewide which leads me to remind anyone with a respiratory condition to take care, ensure you have a plan and access to medication.

Our Board Chair, Ken Lay will serve as the Bushfire Recovery Victoria (BRV) Chair as this new agency works directly with local communities to rebuild and recover from these devastating bushfires. AV will be undertaking a number of fund raising initiatives in support of those affected by the bushfires and we have launched our statewide Fire Recovery and Support Plan for our staff who are affected either professionally or personally.

Such events, whilst tragic also give us the opportunity to see stories highlighting the best of human nature, bravery and resilience. My personal gratitude and thoughts are with all emergency services workers on the frontline today.

Back In July last year I let you know about the TLC Ambulance project that will be supporting children with terminal illness, and their families, to participate in last wish activities such as a trip to the zoo or the beach, in a safe and supported environment. I am pleased to announce that the inaugural trip will be made this month. We have a great team of paramedic volunteers who will support this project and crew the ambulance for these outings which will mean so much to the children and their families/caregivers.

You might start seeing some promotion on Channel 9 for Season 2 of the TV show Paramedics due to air in February depicting a snapshot of what it's like working on the frontline and helps us get vital healthcare messages out to the community. The first season last year reached more than a million viewers a week. You will see some new faces in this next series and they do our profession proud.

wheezing please follow your asthma action plan.

'If you are showing signs of a serious smoke inhalation injury you should be assessed immediately by a medical professional such as a paramedic or a GP,' Mr Dunlop said.

'Anyone with less urgent concerns about their health should seek medical advice or call NURSE-ON-CALL on 1300 60 60 74

'Symptoms can include itchy eyes, sore throat and runny nose through to shortness of breath, coughing, vomiting, nausea, and confusion.'

People should guard against exposure to smoke by taking some simple precautions:

Stay inside your house if possible; close all windows and doors

If you use an air conditioner switch it to "recycle" or "recirculate"

Avoid exercise.

Ordinary paper dust masks and handkerchiefs won't filter out fine particles from bushfire smoke – use a special 'P2/N95' filter mask, which you can get at a hardware store but be sure they fit properly and you have no medical issues that would prevent use

## Retired and Former Employee Peer Support Program

Although your direction has changed, we still share the same journey.

The Retired and Former Employee (RAFE) Peer Support Program is a new program available to all former employees of Ambulance Victoria.

The program allows volunteers to provide confidential support to previous employees who have retired or resigned and assist in linking them into appropriate support if requiring counselling or experiencing mental health issues.

RAFE volunteers are *not* qualified counsellors and are unable to make psychological assessments, but they do have great listening and communication skills that allow them to assist those who are seeking help.

Ambulance Victoria encourages all former employees to engage with this service – which is free – if they feel they require help.


