Basic first aid saves a Sunbury toddler

Basic first aid was not so basic when it saved the life of a three-year-old boy when he fell from a first-floor window.

The parents of the Sunbury toddler who survived the terrifying fall in March are thanking paramedics for saving the life of their son Noah and raising awareness of the critical skill of basic first aid.

Noah's mother, Rachael, called Triple Zero within seconds of the accident as her first aid training kicked in – keeping

Noah alive until paramedics arrived

Mobile Intensive Care Ambulance (MICA) and Air MICA crews provided specialist care to Noah on the way to the Royal Children's Hospital.

AV Metro Regional Director Michael Georgiou said it is crucial parents learn basic first aid. "Knowing what to do in the first minutes of an emergency can make a massive difference to the eventual outcome," he said.

"We encourage all Victorians to contribute to improved patient outcomes by learning the skills to respond to health emergencies

Rachael said the community's support since the accident had been incredible.

"There's still a long way to go in his recovery, but he's done better than anyone would have thought," Rachael said.

"You never think that something so serious is ever going to happen to your child. I'm glad I had the first aid training to know what to do."

Just four weeks after the accident, little Noah was discharged from hospital, and his mother said he was back to being the happy, friendly and bubbly kid he always had been.

Retired and Former Employee (RAFE) Peer Support Program

Ambulance Victoria (AV) are committed to improving the mental health of its people, even after they have left the organisation. Whilst working for an emergency service is rewarding, it also comes with a range of unique challenges.

In 2018, AV in collaboration with the Retired Ambulance Association of Victoria (RAAV) introduced a Peer Support Program for retired and former AV employees which provides access to:

Peer Support (1800 626 377, option 1)

24/7 phone counselling line* (1800 626 377, option 2)

Chaplaincy (1800 626 377, option 3)

VACU clinician network appointment*

Other services readily available in the community

*Available to former employees for the first 12 months following separation from AV

The RAFE Peer Support team are not counsellors and do not make psychological assessments. They are trained to deliver psychological first aid and have excellent listening skills.

The RAFE program is designed to facilitate connection, opportunities for social support and access to community support services. Access to the RAFE program is free of charge and any retired or former AV employee who feels they require support is encouraged to do so.

The RAFE volunteer Peers are available to provide support seven days a week, 7am-5pm.

Mornington Peninsula Paramedic honoured with Ambulance Service Medal

Congratulations to Mornington Peninsula paramedic Joanne Wilton, who has been recognised with an Ambulance Service Medal for her tireless work in community engagement.

Jo commenced service with AV in 2000 as an Advanced Life Support Paramedic and since joining the service, she has undertaken many leadership roles and made a significant contribution to the critical area of cardiac arrest.



Through strong community engagement, she has improved public training and response to potentially life-threatening cardiac events through her passion and determination in the local Mornington Peninsula area.

Jo and her team forged strong relationships with community leaders, stakeholders, and the broader community through CPR training (Call-Push-Shock) sessions, with over 600 public members taking part in the 21/22 year alone.

Further, Jo is a strong advocate for the GoodSAM initiative and spends much time at community events encouraging locals to register.

This work has played a significant role in securing the donation of over 24 additional AEDs for

the district, which led the Mornington Peninsula Council to partner with AV to ensure more AEDs are located in local businesses. Jo's passion and leadership have resulted in an increase in the availability of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) within the community and ensured existing AEDs are registered.

During her 22-year career at Ambulance Victoria, Jo has done an incredible job supporting and encouraging her community to learn life-saving skills, and there is no doubt her leadership her efforts will result in saving countless lives and improve the resilience and capability of the community.
