I started work in1974 at age 17 as a cadet ambulance officer at the then Peninsula Ambulance Service. It obviously didn't work as my association with ambulance lasted 42 years.

I stayed at 'PY' for 10 years before moving to Sale in East Gippsland. During my time in Gippsland I worked mainly in Sale. I was appointed as SO Comms in 1986 and during the 'Kennett' years the control rooms were amalgamated, from this our Sale Comms was closed and I was subsequently appointed Station Officer at Sale an on-road position I shared with Ken Curtis.

Due to government initiatives a push was on for Ambulance to become involved in Quality Assurance, each region required a representative on a VASA committee and I was Gippsland's representative. I went on to study Business Management at Monash and QA at RMIT becoming RAV's Quality Manager in Ballarat after the regional ambulance services were amalgamated in 1998.

In 2003 I returned to Gippsland as the Team Manager at Maffra, this was a single officer response branch with ACO accompaniment and a real learning curve for me. After many years of pushing, we finally achieved more staff which blossomed from initially myself as the only permanently appointed officer at the branch to the present day where 10 is the minimum and many more attached to the branch on admin status.

Wellness and Wellbeing

The incoming RAAV committee have engaged in considerable discussion on how we can improve upon RAAV's current welfare program.

Previous Committees and individuals have laid a solid foundation of welfare support which currently exists of;

- Welfare Officer and a small number of Welfare Liaison people providing support in times of need.
- RAFE Peer Support Program. Implemented following an approach from RAAV to AV to support Members requiring psychological support from work-related traumatic and non-traumatic injuries and/or critical incidents. RAFE is an integral component of AV's Mental Health and Wellbeing Action Plan 2022-2025.
- Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care which includes both AV appointed and volunteer Chaplains representing a broad range of denominations and multi-faith.

The core of these discussions focused on *"what are the key needs of RAAV Members in addition to on-going Mental Health and Wellbeing support?"*

Two key points became obvious, we are an aging group, initially formed to maintain an on-going *"social connection"* with our work colleagues and our *"wellbeing"* as we navigate the inevitable aging process.

Hence the terms "Wellbeing and Welfare" and "Mates looking after Mates" evolved. A quick review of support programs that target for first responders across all emergency services, focuses on the mental health aspect of wellbeing and quite rightly so.

There does not appear to be any programs that caters for aged related medical conditions be they chronic or acute situations.

What is being proposed with the term "Wellbeing and Welfare" is aimed at more encompassing of the type of support we would like to offer to RAAV members and their families.

"Mates looking after Mates".

The vision/plan being formed is a network of members in every RAAV district supporting/working with District Coordinators and the members of that district. This support could simply be catching up for a coffee and chat, getting older members to district lunches. Assisting a member to attend medical appointments and the like.

With the assistance of the Welfare Coordinator organising chaplaincy and pastoral care support, being able to provide a list of Clinical Psychologist linked to AV VACU network to whom our members may wish to seek a referral to when the need arises.

Obtain/compile useful information to assist with navigating the likes of *MyAged* Care (personal experience with immediate family members, demonstrated it's a frustrating and time consuming process). Overtime the plan is to prepare a list of different medical specialists such as Gerontologists etc. to support our members should the need arise, especially for our regional members.

Importantly we will be sourcing training programs which will support those members who chose to undertake the role of Welfare Liaison. There are number of providers other than AV such as Phoenix, Beyond Blue plus the private training providers for Mental Health &/or Psychological first aid.

This is not going to happen overnight, and we need your input to assist with developing this program. We have received positive feedback so far when discussing our plans, both from within and external to ambulance.

From The Museum.

About Your Ambulance Museum Heritage.

The Ambulance Historical Society Victoria Inc. was originally incepted in the early 1980s by **Neale Johnson**, **Ron Jacobs**, and **Pam Smith** together with a small group of retired Ambulance personnel. However, due to

funding cuts in the Firman era, the AHSV became redundant. The 5 vintage vehicles previously purchased lay in storage around Melbourne until 2006 when then AV CEO **Greg Sassella** became aware of a vacant AV leased building at Thomastown. It was then he approached retired Ambo **Chas Martin (OAM)** to create an **Ambulance Victoria Museum** at this location. At the time, Chas was President of RAAV and in the process of developing this organisation. However, Chas took on this museum request with vigor as well as maintaining the RAAV presidency and development. With very limited assistance by 2012 Chas had increased the vintage fleet to 12 vehicles, a host of equipment and memorabilia,

and the Thomastown premises were completely outgrown. In an AV CEO change in 2014, Acting CEO **Tony Walker** quickly secured a larger 3 section commercial building in Bayswater, and the Museum re-located to this area for Chas to develop, often working 24/7.

Sadly, Chas Martin passed away after a short illness in May 2022 leaving his colleagues and people of Victoria a proud and

incredible legacy of our Victorian Ambulance History. This features twenty-five immaculately restored vintage ambulances, including our full size 12-Bed Leyland Disaster bus, a magnificent collection of vintage ambulance equipment, memorabilia, and much more. The museum holds regular group tours for organisations, external display events locally, and regionally, and external speakers, of our history for various meetings. Our Museum is operated solely by dedicated volunteers, a great bunch of friendly blokes, which we are keen to expand upon to meet our charter for the Victorian public. We welcome anyone who would like to spend even a couple of pleasant hours a day, a week, or a month, amongst former colleagues and others. Tasks range particularly for upstairs computer recording, archive, and inventory of museum items, to the essential regular requirements of "Smoko and a yarn'. The museum also supports the quarterly publication for members "**The Beacon**" The hard copy is an A4 quality, 24 PP satin page print with colour and B&W plates.
