President's introduction and welcome

As the festive season rapidly approaches and 2025 draws to a close, it provides an opportunity to pause and reflect on the past year.

Since the 2024 AGM there has been one constant theme which has focused improving our financial recording and reporting systems. Improving our cyber security with the introduction of the traavi.org.au internal administration email system.

Implementing a secure membership database (Airtable) which provides real time accurate information of member details. Also, Airtable now holds individual ambulance work history details along with life membership information to AV Membership Subscription Scheme.

As a result of these surveys, we have complied an extensive database which is available in times of need along with individual Funeral Participation Plans when needed. We received an outstanding return which is unprecedented with these types of surveys. Thank you to everyone for your contribution.

Due to concerted efforts by Committee Members, we now have two new Districts, Echuca and Launceston (Tasmania). We acknowledge the efforts of the Late Peter BRISCOE supported by John and Judy HEAD with getting Echuca established. And Peter JAMES who advocated strongly for Tasmanian Paramedics to join TRAAVI. There are ongoing discussions to establish additional venues in Shepparton and Swan Hill.

In mid-October the TRAAVI Executive met with the new AV CEO Jordan EMERY who requested that we continue our ongoing discussions in the new year along with the Executive Director of People and Culture, Jesse MADDISON. The Executive will continue to advocate for all former employees who face physical and mental health challenges because of their ambulance work history.

It would be remiss not to mention the great support we get from both the volunteer and AV Chaplains. Some of whom are members of TRAAVI provide exceptional support to our members in times of need and often in trying circumstances.

Or maybe directly to one of the Chaplains who attend District meetings. When talking with a Chaplain that conversation remains totally confidential.

Other recent projects have been the Member Attendance Register and the Square Point of Sale both which have been trialled and implemented. See Graham DOUGLAS' Newsletter Membership Report.

There have also been several disappointments over the past year.

Earlier this year we approached two renowned Melbourne based Academic Institutions to conduct survey's on TRAAVI behalf with a focus on looking into ambulance work related physical, traumatic and mental health injuries. This has been a painfully slow and torturous process with no return at this point intime. This is certainly a topic which will be again raised and discussed our next meeting with AV in the New Year.

Securing an appropriately qualified person to become our Treasurer has proven difficult. Early this year Ben ELLIS stepped down to support family members, his replacement also stepped away for similar reasons. Both were eminently capable and brought a set of unique skills to the role of Treasurer.

Without the efforts of the Committee Members, our District Co-ordinators, Welfare Liaison Officers both past and present we would not be able to support our members as we currently do. Thank you everyone.

By nature, TRAAVI's demographic in an aging one and we are always on the lookout for volunteers be that as a Committee Member, District Co-ordinator or Welfare Liaison Officer.

Airtable automations have reduced our administration tasks and time involvement considerably. The more people involved helps to reduce our individual time commitments. Any assistance would be appreciated.

Vice President/Membership Officer

Season's Greetings to all our members from my family to yours.

As 2025 draws to a close I'd like to briefly recap the highlights of this year & give you a glimpse of what's on the horizon for 2026.

- To date this calendar year TRAAVI welcomed 70 new members and farewelled 8 valued members.
- Currently the membership totals 535, with two new applications pending completion.
- One new region, Tasmania, was established in the third quarter and two new Districts held their inaugural meetings, Echuca & Launceston.
- Early in 2026 another three new Districts will hold their inaugural meetings:
- Shepparton on February 9th at the Shepparton RSL, Hobart on February 20th at the Moonah Hotel & Cellars & Swan Hill in March (date/venue to be confirmed).
- The committee re-established close working relationships with AV Executive Officers and in May signed off on a Memorandum of Understanding with AV spanning 4 years.
- The TRAAVI Executive welcomed, updated & are in ongoing discussions with the new AV CEO Jordan Emery, to ensure the changing culture within AV recognises the service record of each in a worthy manner and supports all employees, current or former, with physical or mental challenges as a result of their service.
- Facilitated by utilising the TRAAVI administration system (Airtable) we successfully rolled out & completed the Member Service history survey. The contents of which were presented to Jordan Emery during our initial meeting.
- Airtable also facilitated the digitisation of Funeral planning requests submitted by members. This is an ongoing offering to members. To submit your requests, go to the Members Area on the TRAAVI website.
- Formalised the death & funeral notification process which includes notifications on both the TRAAVI Bulletin Board & via our social media partnership with the Signal 8 AV Facebook group.
- The process also ensures that all relevant member requests & information are made available to those organising our members' final farewell.

At recent meetings, starting with the AGM, Bendigo, Metro North & SW Geelong you may have seen Committee members recording the presence of each attendee.

We were trialling the Member Attendance Record form. The trial enabled the form to be simplified & refined to allow the rapid input of member data recording exactly who attended each meeting (or offered an apology for not attending).

The Committee has approved the rollout of the Attendance Register to all Districts in 2026.

District Coordinators will shortly be contacted about how to access and use the Member Attendance Record form.

Why record attendees?

TRAAVI pays almost \$2800 for public liability insurance.

This ensures our members are protected should they be injured in any way whilst attending any TRAAVI events, these in the main are District Meetings in 3rd party venues.

Without the Member Attendance Record (MAR) we are unable to provide that evidence if and when required.

Both members & non-members attending TRAAVI events need to be noted for insurance purposes.

We have observed that several former ambulance employees regularly attend District meeting who are not TRAAVI members.

The TRAAVI Executive may be placed in the unenviable position of disclaiming responsibility if any of these non-member attendees are injured at an event. If a member chooses to take action against a venue, should they be injured, eventually the venue's insurers come to the TRAAVI insurers to recoup their funds, theoretically TRAAVI's insurers then seek compensation from the injured party (the non-member!).

Currently, these attendees seem to be benefitting off those who chose to join TRAAVI, is this fair to our members?

We may be forced to request a nominal payment by these attendees at each meeting to protect them under the TRAAVI public liability insurance.

In the process of continuing to simplify TRAAVI's administrative processes we have been evaluating several pieces of Point-of-Sale software.

The Committee has accepted Square as the simplest & most cost effective to use & administer. Now that most Committee members have successfully accessed Square on their mobile phones, we will now be offering Square to all District Coordinators to do the same.

Some Coordinators have already volunteered to do so as they see the value in simplifying the purchase of TRAAVI apparel & merchandise.

Also, when member subscription fees are due Square facilitates payment of those fees by members attending the District meetings.

District Coordinators will be receiving an email with the details regarding Square early December, so you'll all have time to implement prior to first meetings of 2026.

In closing I would like to thank all District Coordinators & Welfare Liaisons for all their work during the year. In particular, those members who have volunteered to be Interim District Coordinators in addition to their other administrative roles within the Association.

Navigating the TRAAVI Website - Merchandise Guide


We will be including regular tips in the Newsletter to help members navigate the TRAAVI website. The site contains a wide range of useful information, making it easy to access what you need at any time.

This edition covers how to access the TRAAVI Merchandise section, where you can purchase items such as polo shirts, caps, badges, and stubby holders.


How to Access TRAAVI Merchandise

- 3. Click the down arrow under the Members menu.




4. Select TRAAVI Merchandise from the dropdown list.

5. Click the down arrow again and choose **Merchandise Gallery** to view the full range of items.



Olivine also occurs in high-temperature metamorphic rocks, lunar basalts, and some meteorites. Mortlake is known as the olivine capital of Australia and has the 4th largest deposits in the world.
